

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY

Ed Bache

Mr Bache was appointed as a Consultant to Birmingham Children's Hospital and Royal Orthopaedic Hospital in 2003. He set up a hip clinic in 2005 to provide a hip arthroscopy and osteotomy service in the West Midlands. He has performed large numbers of femoral and pelvic osteotomies in adolescent and young adults. He has extensively published and presented on the issues of developing hip conditions.

Etienne Belzile

Dr Belzile is Assistant Professor, Laval University, Quebec City, Canada. He is on the Board of Directors, Canadian Orthopaedic Foundation, Co-Chair, COA Program Committee 2013-14; 2014 AOA/COA Combined meeting Montreal; Co-Host of 10th Symposium on Joint Preserving and Minimally invasive Surgeryof the hip 2013; Member of the EPCAT II study Steering Committee (CIHR funded); Director of Clinical Research, Orthopaedic Surgery Service, CHUQ, Quebec. He has published and presented extensively on hip joint preservation surgery.

Srino Bharam

Dr Bharam is Clinical Assistant Professor at NYU Hospital for Joint Disease, and Director of Hip Arthroscopy, Lenox Hill Hospital, New York, NY. He has published extensively on Sports Hip issues, and is an accomplished Hip Arthroscopist. He has been on the invited faculty list for many renowned Young Adult Hip Courses, and has been on the distinguished faculty list of ISHA for last four consecutive years.

Geraint Davies

Mr Davies is Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon and the Clinical Director of prestigious Orthopaedic Department of Sheffield Children's Hospital. He has published and presented his treatment results on various developmental hip disorders. He also has interest in the Adolescent sports knee injury problems. He did his fellowship at Toronto Sick Kids under Bob Salter and since then has had extensive experience in various paediatric orthopaedic disorders.

James Fernandes

Mr Fernandes is Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at Sheffield Children's Hospital. He is President Elect of BLRS (British Limb Reconstruction Society), Member of Committee of BSCOS (British Society of Children Orthopaedic Surgery) and Training Programme Director. He has extensive experience in limb and hip reconstruction for developmental disorders. He has organised combined BLRS/BSCOS meeting in the past and he lectures nationally and internationally, has published extensively and is author of several book chapters.

Mark Flowers

Mr Flowers is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at Sheffield Children's Hospital. He is the Secretary of British Society of Children's Orthopaedic Surgery (BSCOS). He trained in London, Birmingham, Sheffield and Toronto. He has a general paediatric practice with particular interest in hip dysplasia. He is involved in the care of children from the post-natal scanning clinic through to periacetabular osteotomies in the young adult.

Andrea Fontana

Professor Dr Fontana is the Director of Orthopaedics and Consultant Hip and Knee Surgeon at Lanzo Hospital Como, Italy. He is the Director Chair (Centre for Hip Arthroscopy Italian Research); Director CARA (Centre for Arthroscopic and Regenerative Hip Surgery); Director International Visiting Centre (DePuy-Mitek-J&J); Director International Visiting Centre (Geistlich). He is reviewer for the American Journal of Sports Medicine. He has published extensively and is renowned in joint preserving surgery of the hip and knee.

Aresh Hashemi-Nejad

Mr Hashemi-Nejad clinical director, Division of Surgery, RNOH, London. He is the President Elect of the British Society of Children Orthopaedic Surgery (BSCOS). He is involved in clinical research and publishing outcomes from operations he performs, and is regularly invited to national and international meetings. He was awarded the American-British-Canadian Travelling Fellowship in 2006, representing British orthopaedics and visiting 20 centres in the United States. In 2011 he was one of only four orthopaedic surgeons nominated in The Times' top 100 doctors. Mr Hashemi-Nejad's main clinical interests are in young adult hip preservation surgery including hip arthroscopy, hip osteotomy and hip replacement surgery. He also deals with paediatric orthopaedic problems. At the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital he has a tertiary practice with these complex problems.

Ingemar Ivarsson

Dr Ivarsson is Assistant Professor and Head of Hip Replacement Team at the University Hospital of Linkoping, Sweden. He accomplished his PhD thesis on arthritis of the knee in 1991 and has been assistant professor of Linkoping University since 1998. During the last 20 years, the main focus both in research and clinic has been on hip arthroplasties, especially revision surgery and replacements in younger people.

Sanjeev Madan

Mr Madan is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at Sheffield Children's Hospital and Doncaster Royal Infirmary. He has a dedicated hip joint preservation and minimally invasive young adult hip referral practice. He is the Research Lead and Limb reconstruction lead. He has published and lectured on the topics of hip joint preservation nationally and internationally.

Olof Risto

Dr Risto is Head of Paediatric Orthopaedic Team at the University Hospital Linkoping, Sweden. His PhD thesis was on heterotopic bone formation after THR which was accomplished in 1994. He is the Assistant Professor and has 30 years experience in treating developmental hip problems. He has a special interest in and experience of children's hip and young adult hip surgery. He pioneered the introduction of the hip dislocation technique in Sweden.

Jorg Schroder

Dr Shroder is Oberarzt at in the Hip Department, Musculoskeletal Center, Charite University Hospital, Berlin. He has published on a unique problem of subspinous impingement and is an accomplished hip arthroscopist.

Richard Villar

Mr Villar is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon in Cambridge and London (UK) and the Founding Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Hip Preservation Surgery, past Editor-in-Chief of The Bone and Joint Journal (formerly JBJS(Br)) and the Founding Editor of Bone and Joint. He writes for both academic and general readerships, has researched extensively, and has more than 200 peer-reviewed publications to his name. His clinical interests centre on surgery for the young adult hip in which he has amassed one of the largest experiences of hip arthroscopic operations in the world. He was the Founding President of the International Society for Hip Arthroscopy, travels and lectures widely, and forms part of the UK's Disaster Emergency Response. He has written a number of books for the general public, including Knife Edge: Life as a Special Forces Surgeon and Winged Scalpel: A Surgeon at the Frontline of Disaster.

Mark Wilkinson

Professor Wilkinson was appointed to an Academic Faculty post at Sheffield University in 2007, and to Chair of Orthopaedics 2012. His research focuses on the interaction between joint prostheses and the patient, and the genetic basis of joint disease. He conducted the first clinical trial of bisphosphonate therapy after hip replacement, and was the first to show genetic variability is a risk factor for prosthesis failure. More recently he was a PI in the arcOGEN study that identified several novel risk loci for osteoarthritis. He sits on the research committees of the BOA, ARUK. He is a recipient of the Robert Jones Gold Medal of the BOA, The McKee Prize of BHS, and the William Harris Award of the Orthopaedic Research Society.

Jamie Wootton

Mr Wootton is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at Wrexham Maelor Hospital. He has established an International reference centre for DAA surgery for Total Hip Replacement and has been involved in the Development of the new AMK knee replacement. He along with his brother Malcolm has made a special table to do DAA THR. Majority of his specialist training was in Australia, where he was based in a sports injury medicine clinic in Sydney.

Luigi Zagra

Professor Dr Zagra is the Head of the Department of renowned Galeazzi Orthopaedic Institute IRCCS, Milan, Italy. He is the Director of ROLP (Arthroplasty Registry of Lombardia). He is the Past President of European Hip Society and President Elect of the Italian Hip Society.
